#### BIBLE

#### 201 BIBLE SWORD DRILL

Bible Sword Drill will be conducted in rounds according to participation. Procedures are as follows:

#### 1. Drill Commands

- a. "Attention" Heels together, shoulders up, hands at side, face the leader
- b. "Draw Swords" Bring Bible to waistline immediately in front of the body. Hands must be placed on the front and back covers of the Bible. At no time, prior to the "charge" command may the thumbs or fingers of either hand extend over the edge of the covers. Either hand may be on top.
- c. "Assignment" The leader announces the drill. The assignment is given twice, slowly and distinctly. (e.g., "Character drill. Jonathan. Jonathan.")
- d. "Charge" At this command, every member of the group begins to search for the Scripture and time begins.
- e. "Time" The timekeeper allows 20 seconds before calling time. This is the signal for all to stop searching, and the score is taken. The leader then selects one contestant to give correct answer.

### 2. Types of Drills

- a. Scripture Searching Drill A Scripture reference is given by the leader. The contestants must find the exact passage.
- b. Unfinished Quotation Drill The leader quotes the first part of a verse of Scripture. The contestants must know its location and turn to it in the Bible.
- c. Character Drill The name of a Bible character is given by the leader. The contestants must find the name of the person in a Bible verse.
- d. Book Drill In this drill, the name of a book in the Bible is given by the leader. Contestants must find the book and be ready to tell which book comes before and which follows it before stepping forward.
- e. Topical Drill The leader gives a word or phrase and the contestants must find that particular word or phrase contained in a verse of Scripture. Each may have a different passage.
- f. Doctrinal Drill The leader asks the group to find a verse in the Bible setting forth some Bible doctrine. For example, "Find a verse which proves that faith in Christ saves"; or "Find a verse proving that all have sinned." The contestants must locate a "proof" verse.

#### 3. Scoring

- a. Ten points shall be awarded to the first contestant to step forward; five points to the second; and one point to each of the others who step forward before time is called.
- b. The contestant must have his finger on the correct passage (or book) before stepping forward and should remain at attention with Bible open and finger on the correct passage (or book) until the drillmaster directs the contestants to step back to their original position. If a contestant steps forward but realizes he does not

- have the correct verse and steps back he may not again step forward. An infraction of this rule draw a ten-point penalty.
- c. If a Bible is held improperly, a penalty of ten points will be incurred.
- d. A continuous infraction of the rules or unbecoming conduct will disqualify a contestant from further participation. The decision rests with the judges.
- e. The timekeeper should use a regular stopwatch if available. A timepiece with a large second hand may be substituted when necessary.
- f. Contestants with the most points will advance to the final round. The contestant with the highest number of points in the final round shall be declared the winner. In the event of a tie, three additional items will be used in a tie-breaking drill. All rules apply as in the original drill.

#### 104, 204 BIBLE MEMORY

Bible Memory competition will be conducted in the traditional spelling bee format. Procedures are as follows:

- 1. All contestants shall form a single line facing the Master and be questioned from left to right. Each contestant should have a name tag or number supplied by the Master.
- 2. The Master will conduct these rounds of questioning:
  - Round 1: Master cites reference; contestant recites verse.
  - Round 2: Master cites topic; contestant cites both reference and verse.
  - Round 3: Master cites reference; contestant cites topic.

Additional rounds may be deemed necessary by the Master in order to reduce a group of contestants:

Optional Round 4: Master cites references one by one; contestant recites as many consecutive verses as he can without error.

Optional Round 5: Level II only: Master cites *ten* or more references; contestants write verses (spelling and punctuation mistakes do *not* constitute errors).

- 3. Each contestant shall be given a different reference, verse, or topic from that given the preceding contestant.
- 4. The contestant shall not begin speaking until the Master finishes giving the reference or verse or topic.
- 5. A contestant shall be permitted *one* error before his elimination. A contestant will be eliminated upon commission of a second error.
- 6. The following constitute errors:
  - A. Any incorrect reference.
  - B. Any deviation from the verbatim quotation of Scripture: any addition, omission, reversal, or change of words.
  - C. Incomplete answers at the call of time.
  - D. A contestant may stop and begin again, but he must quote exactly as he did before. If he changes anything, he will be declared in error.
  - E. Only *one* error per question may be scored against a contestant.

- F. Pronunciation mistakes are *not* considered errors.
- 7. The contestant shall have exactly *ten* seconds to cite a reference and *thirty-five* seconds to quote a verse, verse and reference, or topic.
  - A. Timing begins when the Master finishes speaking.
  - B. If the contestant wishes a repetition of the reference or verse, he may ask, "Please repeat." This does not count against his time.
  - C. Only one repeat per question is permissible.
- 8. The correct reference or verse or topic shall always be given after an error has been declared, except when only two contestants remain.
- 9. When only two contestants remain, the procedure changes:
  - A. If each one has committed *one* error, at that point, when one commits an error, the other shall be given an opportunity to answer the *same* reference or verse. If the second contestant answers correctly *plus* the next verse or reference correctly, he will be declared champion.
  - B. If one of the contestants commits an error and the other contestant, after correcting the first error, commits an error on the extra reference or verse, the first contestant may attempt to answer the extra reference or verse. If the first contestant then succeeds in correcting that error and then correctly answers another extra reference or verse, he shall be declared champion.
  - C. If both finalists commit errors on the same reference or verse, both shall continue in competition. The correct answer will be given by the Master and the next reference or verse to the first one who erred. Competition resumes under the previous rules in 9, a and b.
- 10. In case of a continuing tie, it is the Master's discretion to continue standard rounds or to institute any optional rounds.
- 11. Any question relating to the reference or quotation of a verse shall be referred to the Judge and Master immediately. Please do so by raising the hand and stating "question." No protest shall be entertained after a contested question has been given to another contestant. If only two contestants remain, and both have missed the same question, a protest must be made before the correct answer is given by the Master.
- 12. The Master and Judge have complete authority and control. Their decision shall be final in any dispute. They may use the tape of the contest as reference.
- 13. The King James Version of the Scriptures shall be the only translation acceptable for SCACS Bible Memory competition.
- 14. No student may study or check a list to refresh his memory during a break.
