

# HEALTHY HABITS with Mrs. Rohr


A regular reading habit comes with a host of benefits for all students

"Making daily reading practice a system-wide objective may be one of the most important

things we can do for our students' long-term outcomes" (Renaissance).

Reading is important and comes with a litany of benefits. Take a look at the list below of the benefits of reading, compiled from Graduate Programs for Educators:

- Brain exercise leading to enhance cognitive agility
- Improved focus
- Increased critical-thinking skills
- Vocabulary expansion
- Better writing skills
- Improved reading comprehension
- Empathy cultivation
- Social-emotional learning opportunities
- Overall promotion of well-being
- Improved academic performance overall
- Cultivates curiosity





Mrs. Rohr is the high school English teacher and has a bachelor's degree in English.

As a parent, I look at that list and desire all of those things for all of my children, and I desire them for the students in my classroom, as well. It's heartening to know that just one activity for 15 to 30 minutes a day can help achieve all of these benefits *and* foster a love of learning that can last for a lifetime.

Many classes at Calvary have daily reading as a homework requirement, but there are other ways to encourage your student(s) to read regularly. Let them choose what they read for fun (subject to your approval, of course). Read together as a family, or have weekly or monthly reading challenges. Participate in your local library's reading challenges, as well as the CCS Summer Reading Program.
