


HEALTHY HABITS

with Mrs. VE

February lands us right in the middle of third quarter—when routines feel heavy, motivation runs low, and it's tempting to coast instead of finish strong. This is often when healthy habits matter most, not just academically, but spiritually too.

One simple habit I love to encourage students to start with is this: make your bed each morning. It's a small act of discipline, but it's also a moment of gratitude—gratitude for rest, for shelter, and for a new day. Let it also be a moment to talk with God. Before the rush begins, acknowledge Him, invite Him into your day, and commit your thoughts and choices to Him.

Discipline and consistency may not feel exciting, but I promise they will serve you well in every area of life, starting with the most important relationship you have—your relationship with God.

One theme comes up again and again in prayer requests with my middle and high school students: help me choose what is right and honor God—especially when it comes to time management, electronics and distractions. Scripture reminds us that “the thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy” (John 10:10). Often, the enemy doesn't steal joy or purpose in big, obvious ways—but quietly, through distractions that pull us away from time with God and from responsibilities that shape our future.

This old saying came to mind as I prayed over this article:

Watch your thoughts; they become your words.

Watch your words; they become your actions.

Watch your actions; they become your habits.

Watch your habits; they become your character.


Watch your character; it becomes your identity.

Healthy study and organization habits are built through daily choices. Focus on your responsibilities rather than distracting yourself with electronics—because distractions won't earn the grades, build the character, open the doors, or draw you closer to Christ. Jesus reminds us, “But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you” (Matthew 6:33). Finish this quarter strong by choosing habits that honor God. Those choices—made daily—will shape who you become.


